WIDE OPEN TO HEAVEN & EARTH: Contemplation, Community, Culture

The Tenth General Meeting of the International Thomas Merton Society

Christian Brothers University – Memphis, TN – June 7-10, 2007

In June, 2007, the International Thomas Merton Society will hold its Tenth General Meeting in Memphis, TN, on the campus of Christian Brothers University, a Catholic school in the Lasallian tradition, founded in 1871 by the Brothers of the Christian Schools. Set upon 75 acres close to the center of Memphis, CBU is home for 2000 students as well as home to the Gandhi Center for Nonviolence. Memphis—named after the ancient *desert* city of Memphis, Egypt—is the largest city in Tennessee, and the 18th largest city in the United States.

Featured participants in the conference include:

- **James Forest**, close friend and correspondent of Thomas Merton, is currently secretary of the Orthodox Peace Fellowship; he is the author of the Merton biography, *Living with Wisdom*.
- **Arun Gandhi** is the grandson of Mohandas Gandhi and founder of the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence at Christian Brothers University; he is the author of numerous books on Gandhi and nonviolence.
- **Bishop Thomas Gumbleton** has served as auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Detroit since 1968 and pastor of St. Leo Church in inner-city Detroit since 1983; he was the founding president of Pax Christi USA, and continues to speak widely on issues of peace and social justice.
- **Joyce Hollyday** is a United Church of Christ minister in Asheville, NC and a former associate editor of *Sojourners* magazine; she was a founding member of Witness for Peace and is the author of several books including *Then Shall Your Light Rise: Spiritual Formation and Social Witness*.
- **Albert J. Raboteau** is a professor at Princeton University, specializing in American religious history with a focus on American Catholic history and African-American religious movements; he is the author *A Fire in the Bones*, which includes a chapter on Merton and Martin Luther King, Jr.
- **Paul M. Pearson**, director of The Merton Center at Bellarmine University, and editor of Merton's *Seeking Paradise: The Spirit of the Shakers*, will deliver the presidential address.

Many other Merton scholars will also be participating in concurrent sessions and workshops.

Other highlights will include:

- An opening ecumenical prayer ceremony and celebration
- Tour of The National Civil Rights Museum
- Special musical guests

Registration fee is \$150.00 for ITMS members (\$200.00 for non-members; for information on ITMS membership, see within). Lodging is \$150.00; arrangements can be made for those who need to arrive Wednesday evening or stay over Sunday evening (see additional lodging fee). All fees must be included with completed form. For those preferring to stay off-campus, motels and restaurants are easily accessible to the meeting site (a list of accommodations will be mailed to those requesting it). Directions to the campus and/or information about transportation from the airport will be provided with registration confirmation. 
