The Twelfth General Meeting of the International Thomas Merton Society

Loyola University – Chicago, IL – June 9-12, 2011

In June 2011 the International Thomas Merton Society will hold its Twelfth General Meeting in Chicago, IL, at Loyola University's Lake Shore campus. Loyola University Chicago was founded in 1870 as St. Ignatius College. It is the nation's largest Jesuit, Catholic University and the only one located in Chicago.


Featured participants in the conference include:

- **Robert F. Morneau**, who has served as auxiliary bishop of the Roman Catholic diocese of Green Bay since 1979. He is the author of several books including *The Color of Gratitude: And Other Spiritual Surprises*, *Pathways to Relationship*, and *A Retreat with C. S. Lewis*. His articles appear frequently in many periodicals. He is very popular as a retreat director and lecturer throughout the United States.
- Martin E. Marty, Fairfax M. Cone Distinguished Service Professor Emeritus at the University of Chicago, where he has taught primarily at the Divinity School for over 35 years. Marty has written over 50 books, including *Righteous Empire*, winner of the National Book Award, the three-volume *Modern American Religion*, *The One and the Many: America's Search for the Common Good* and *The Mystery of the Child*.
- James Conner, OCSO, a monk of the Abbey of Gethsemani. He was a student of Thomas Merton and was Merton's undermaster for novices. He has served as chaplain to the Benedictine Community of Osage Monastery, Oklahoma, and, for five years in the late nineties, as Abbot of Assumption Abbey in Missouri. He was fourth President of the ITMS and has written on Thomas Merton in *Cistercian Studies Quarterly, The Merton Annual*, and in the volume *Thomas Merton Monk: A Monastic Tribute*.
- Esther de Waal, an Anglican scholar of the Benedictine and Celtic traditions of Christian spirituality. Her published work includes *The Way of Simplicity: The Cistercian Tradition, Seeking God: The Way of St. Benedict, A Seven Day Journey with Thomas Merton, and God Under My Roof: Celtic Songs and Blessings.* She lives in Hereford near the Welsh border.
- **Douglas Burton-Christie**, author of *The Word in the Desert*, editor of the journal *Spiritus* and professor at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, where he teaches theology and spirituality. He has a longstanding interest in the traditions arising out of the early desert monastic movement, and is currently completing work on a book, *The Blue Sapphire of the Mind: Notes for a Contemplative Ecology*.
- **Robert G. Grip**, ITMS President and news anchor at WALA television in Mobile, AL. He has served as an ITMS Board member, treasurer and vice president, and as the program chair for the ITMS Fifth General Meeting; he has regularly presented the "First-timers' Session" at ITMS General Meetings.

Many other Merton scholars will also be participating in concurrent sessions and workshops, including a panel on Thomas Merton and Dorothy Day with Robert Ellsberg, Tom Cornell and Rosalie Riegle.
