Major Gift to Merton Center

Manuscripts and other papers by Thomas Merton appraised at a value of nearly one million dollars have recently been donated to the Thomas Merton Center at Bellarmine University, Louisville, KY by Merton's longtime editor Robert Giroux. The gift is the largest single addition to the archives at the Center, the major repository for Merton's papers, since the core of the collection was received from Merton himself and from the Abbey of Gethsemani in the years leading up to and shortly after Merton's death in 1968. It follows a previous donation of materials by Mr. Giroux in 2001 valued at more than \$200,000, which at the time he believed included all the Merton-related documents in his possession.

The more than 3000 pages of newly discovered documents include drafts or proofs of five books: The Waters of Siloe, The Sign of Jonas, Thoughts in Solitude, Disputed Questions, and The Ascent to Truth, of which four heavily edited versions were found. Among the other materials are a draft of Merton's never-published book "Art and Worship," letters between Merton and Giroux, versions of numerous essays, and even a rejection slip from Harcourt, Brace, Giroux's original firm, dating from 1940, in which the publisher's reader said of one of Merton's early autobiographical novels, "I think Mr. Merton's got something, but not quite enough to do anything about."

The new materials will be made available for research along with the rest of the Center's collection of over 50,000 items. In an interview with *The Louisville Courier-Journal*, Center director Dr. Paul M. Pearson predicted that scholars "would have a field day" investigating the newly received documents.

Spanish Merton Conference

The first international Thomas Merton conference to be held in Spain, entitled "Seeds of Hope: Thomas Merton's Contemplative Message," will take place October 27-29, 2006 at the Auditorio Municipal de San Francisco in Avila. The conference is co-sponsored by the Centro Internacional de Estudios Místicos in Avila and the Thomas Merton Center of Bellarmine University.

Presenters will include: conference co-director Fernando Beltrán Llavador: "Thomas Merton and 'The Great Feast of Christian Hope"; conference co-director Paul M. Pearson: "Emblems for a Season of Furv: The Art of Thomas Merton"; Fr. James Conner, OCSO: "Thomas Merton: Monk and Spiritual Master"; James Forest: "Thomas Merton as a Living Bridge Linking Christians East and West"; Erlinda G. Paguio: "Hope as an Unexpected, Incomprehensible and Total Gift: Reflections on Merton's Life and Writings": Fr. Francisco Rafael de Pascual, OCSO: "The Secret Hope and the Hoped-for Secret: Keys for Life"; Sonia Petisco: "O Sweet Escape! O Smiling Flight!': Recital and Commentaries to a Selection of Poems by Thomas Merton"; Cristóbal Serran-Pagan y Fuentes: "Seeds of Hope in Times of Crisis: Saint John of the Cross and Thomas Merton": and Bonnie Thurston: "A Realm of White Hot Faith': Thomas Merton on Islam in Spain."

The conference will be opened by Miguel Ángel García Nieto, the Mayor of Ávila and President of the Municipal Foundation of Mystical Studies. The program will also include liturgy of the hours with the Benedictine monks of Santo Domingo de Silos and Cistercian monks and nuns, times for prayer and contemplation, celebration of the Eucharist, cultural activities, and visits to the town, best known through its associations with the Spanish mystics St. Teresa and St. John of the Cross.

Registration fees for the conference are \$75 until August 31, 2006, and \$100 thereafter (until October 16). Checks, payable to "Merton Conference," may be sent to Dr. Paul M.
