THOMAS MERTON (1915-1968):

CONFERENCES, COMMEMORATIONS, FESTIVALS, BOOKS, ARTICLES, AND FESTSCHRIFTS TWENTY YEARS LATER

Twenty years ago — on December 10, 1968 — Thomas Merton died in Bangkok, Thailand. 1988 also marks other anniversaries in Merton's life — the fiftieth anniversary of his baptism in 1938 and the fortieth anniversary of the publication of his signal work, *The Seven Storey Mountain*, in 1948. It is a busy year with many events and many publications. I have been asked by several people to give, here in *The Merton Seasonal*, an overview (for the record) of events and publications — a nearly impossible task in this short space.

Publication has been heavy, distinguished by the appearance of three books and one previously unpublished article by Merton himself: The Alaskan Journal of Thomas Merton, edited by Robert E. Daggy (reviewed in the Spring issue by Brother Patrick Hart); Encounter: Thomas Merton and D. T. Suzuki, edited by Robert E. Daggy (reviewed in this issue by Chalmers MacCormick); A Vow of Conversation: Journals, 1964-1965, edited by Naomi Burton Stone (two reviews in this issue by James T. Fisher and Thomas McLaughlin, O.S.B.); and "The Zen Insight of Shen Hui," edited by Brother Patrick Hart, which appeared in the inaugural volume of The Merton Annual. kentucky poetry review has dubbed its Autumn 1988 issue a "Thomas Merton Issue" with five unpublished poems by Merton, a few poems written to and for Merton, and several new contributions by poets included by Merton in 1968 in his "little magazine," Monks Pond.

The Merton Annual 1, edited by Robert E. Daggy, Brother Patrick Hart, Dewey Weiss Kramer, and Victor A. Kramer, debuted in 1988 and is reviewed in this issue by Anthony T. Padovano and Arthur W. Biddle. M. Basil Pennington, O.C.S.O., has edited papers from the Kalamazoo "Merton Conference" in 1986 under the title Toward an Integrated Humanity: Thomas Merton's Journey" and this festschrift type volume is reviewed in this issue by Brother Columban (Richard) Weber, O.C.S.O. The Roundtable devoted its Summer issue to Merton with contributions by Thomas Nelson, C.M., Daniel Berrigan, S.J., and Mary Luke Tobin, S.L. Living Prayer, supported by Merton in 1968 as Contemplative Review, celebrates its twentieth anniversary with a Merton number, details of which are given later in this issue. America, 22 October 1988, was a Merton issue with essays by Christine M. Bochen, Robert E. Daggy, Robert Giroux, Ronald E. Powaski, William H. Shannon, and Bonnie Bowman Thurston; poetry by Eric Jensen and Frederick Zydek; and a review by George A. Kilcourse. We feature two of the drawings by Chuck Trapkus.
